Format?	The Putnam is a 2-Session paper-and-pencil written competition – no
	calculators or other aids allowed. Each Session consists of 6 challenging
	problems or puzzles; participants provide explanations or proofs of the
	solutions. Some students try both Sessions; others elect to try only one.
	Each university registers with their count of participants in October, and
	the contest booklets are mailed. The Faculty Supervisor will proctor the
	Sessions on the Competition day, always the 1 st Saturday of December.
